

DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) of St Matthew's Parish Church, Oxhey



1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

2. Who are we?

The PCC of St Matthew's, Oxhey is the Data Controller. This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes. The Data Protection Compliance Officer for the time being is Daphne Boskey (contact details below).

3. How do we process your personal data?

The PCC of St Matthew's, Oxhey complies with its obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To further the purposes of St Matthew's Parish Church in the Parish as a public benefit;
- To administer contact records;
- To fundraise and promote the interests of the church;
- To manage our volunteers;
- To maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications);
- To inform of news, events, activities and services running at St Matthew's Oxhey church and hall and within the Diocese of St Albans.

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about diocesan events.
- Processing is necessary for carrying out obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement;
- Processing is carried out by St Matthew's Oxhey PCC, a not-for-profit body with a religious aim, provided: -
 - the processing relates only to those who have regular contact with it in connection with those purposes; and
 - there is no disclosure to a third party without consent.

5. Sharing your personal data

Personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other PCC Officers of the church in order to carry out a service to other church users or for purposes connected with the church. We will only share your data with third parties outside the parish with your consent.

6. How long do we keep your personal data¹?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance set out in the guide “Keep or Bin: Care of Your Parish Records” which is available from the Church of England website [see footnote for link].

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate; Baptism and Marriage registers are retained permanently.

7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which the PCC of St Matthew’s, Oxhey holds about you;
- The right to request that the PCC of St Matthew’s, Oxhey corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for the PCC of St Matthew’s, Oxhey to retain such data;
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time;
- The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability);
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data;
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner’s Office.

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
